China Town & Kensington Market Walking Tour

Toronto's Chinatown is one of the **largest in North America**. Visiting China Town is an exciting experience for anyone. Only a few minutes' walk away from China Town you will find another exciting neighbourhood – Kensington Market. The Market is a unique shopping experience, a community worth living in and an artistic haven.

Scarborough Bluffs Park

There are nine parks along the bluffs, with Bluffers Park being the only one with a beach. Forming much of the eastern portion of Toronto waterfront, the Scarborough Bluffs stands above the shoreline of Lake Ontario. **Lovely view** and a good variety of things to do for people.



The Distillery District is a commercial and residential district in Toronto. Art lovers come for the galleries, outdoor sculptures and dance, music and stage performances at the area's several theatres. In December, the annual Toronto **Christmas Market** takes over the streets.
